- (a) ForeignNational:means acitizen ofanycountryotherthan India.
- (b) Person of Indian Origin (PIO): means a person who is citizen of other countries(except Pakistan and Bangladesh) who at any time held an Indian passport, or whoor either of his parents or any of his grandparents was a citizen of India by virtue of the provisions of the Constitution of India or Section 2(b) of Citizenship Act, 1955 (ActNo.57of1955)
 - c) International Student: means an international student who possesses a foreignpassport.
 - d) Non-Resident Indian (NRI) (as per Income tax Act, 1961)As per Income TaxAct, 1961, an individual is nonresident for income tax purpose, when he is 'not aresident' or who is 'not ordinarily resident'. A person is treated as 'non ordinarilyresident'if anyof thefollowing conditionis satisfied:
 - 1. IfhehasnotbeenresidentinIndiain9outof10precedingyears.OR
 - 2. If he has not been in India for a period of 730 days or more during the preceding7years. Aperson, who is non-

residentinIndiaornotordinarilyresident,istaxedinIndiaonlyforhisincomein India.Heisnottaxed in Indiaforincomeabroad.

3. CANCELLATIONOFADMISSIONANDREFUNDOFFEESFOR B.A.LL.BANDLL.B:

The candidate cancelling his confirmed admission will be entitled to receive the refund of fees as per CETRules.

DISCIPLINARY RULES:

- 1. Minimum 75% attendance in each subject is compulsory as per University rules.
- 2. Students will not be permitted to appear for internal examinations without fulfilling 75% attendance criteria.
- 3. Students must be punctual for all classes.
- 4. Law courses taught in the college are professional courses and students must dress appropriately for the same.
- 5. Dress Code:

ANTI-RAGGING RULES



The Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999

An Act to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of MaharashtraWHEREASit is expedient to enact a special law to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of Maharashtra. It is hereby enacted in the Fiftieth Year oftheRepublicof Indiaasfollows:

- 1. "Ragging" means display of disorderly conduct, doing of any act which causes oris likely to cause physical psychological harm or raise apprehension of fear orshameorembarrassmenttoastudentinanyeducationalinstitutionandincludes
 - i. Teasing, abusing, threatening or playing practical jokes on, or causing hurtto, such student: or
 - ii. Asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student willnot,intheordinarycourse,willinglydo.
- 2. Prohibitionofraggingwithinoroutsideofanyeducationalinstitutionisprohibited.
- 3. Penalty for ragging whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abetsorpropagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also beliable to a fine which may extend to the tenthousand rupees.
- 4. Dismissal of student any student convicted of an offence under the Act shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
